Two of the world's most dynamic urban centers, Berlin and New York City, are making radical transformations in their streets and skylines. Berlin-New York Dialogues investigates the changes in these two cities by looking at the contemporary built environment and mechanisms of urban regeneration—the social, political, economic and cultural processes that affect building. As the exhibition delineates, the sustainability of these cities' urban neighborhoods is increasingly dependent on a critical mixture of identity, urban diversification, and functional infrastructure. Against a background of urban data the exhibition brackets three areas of each city. Both high-end projects and informal initiatives are featured, with respect to a set of overriding topics: Culture as Catalyst, Community Activism, Gentrification, Open Space, and Legislative Intervention. Focus is given to the stories and forces behind the projects—the "urban context."
